Q11) I was clear about where I could get help if I had any problems after the injection.



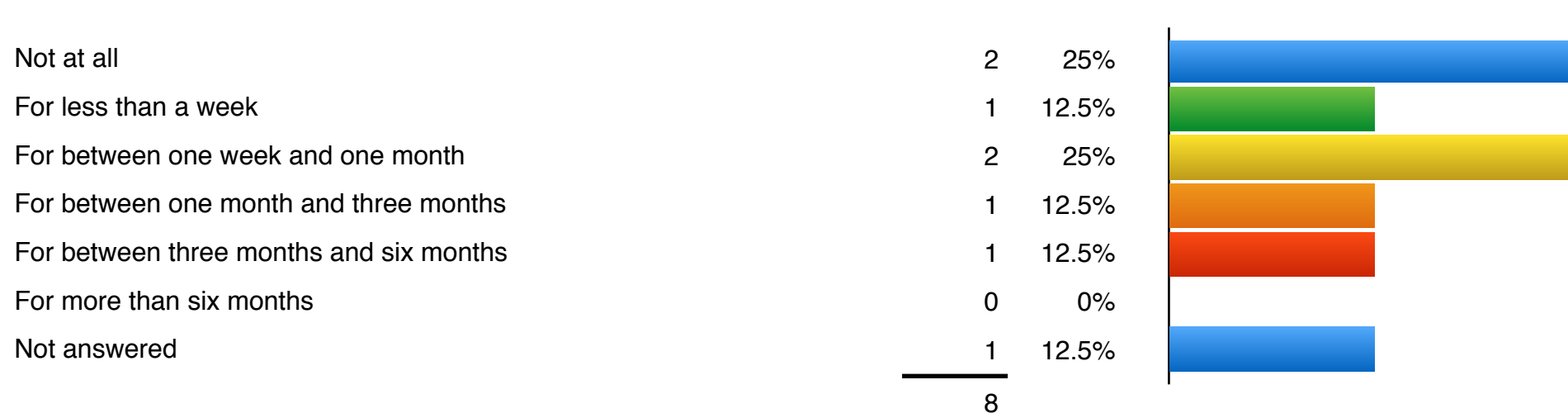
Q12) I was satisfied with the arrangements that were made for me to be reviewed after the injection.

Q15) The injection helped relieve stiffness



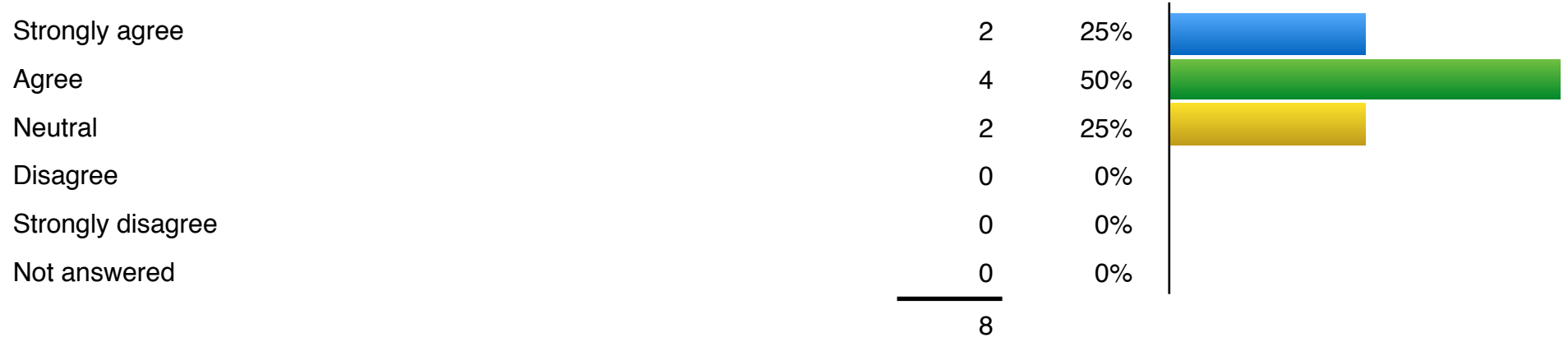
Q16) The injection helped me to get back to "normal" activity.



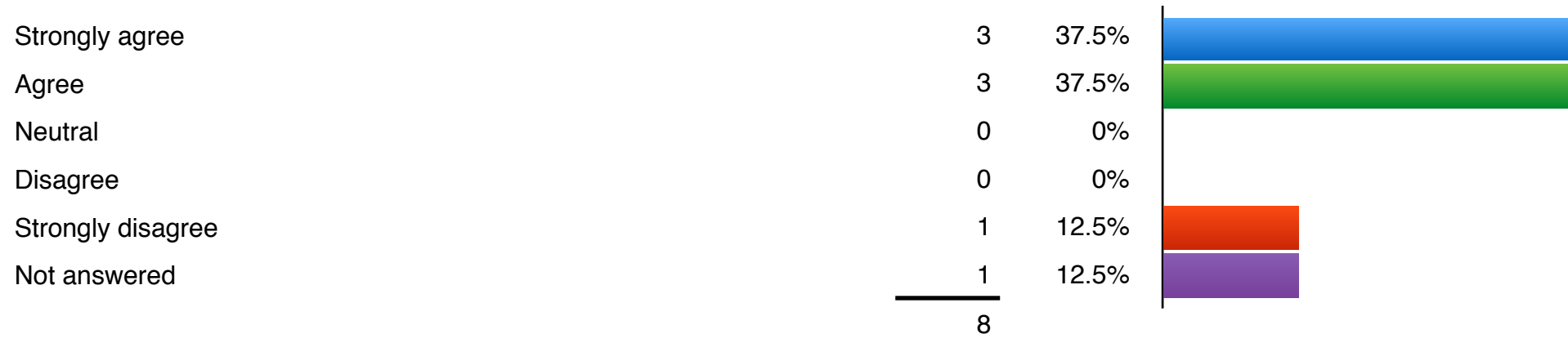

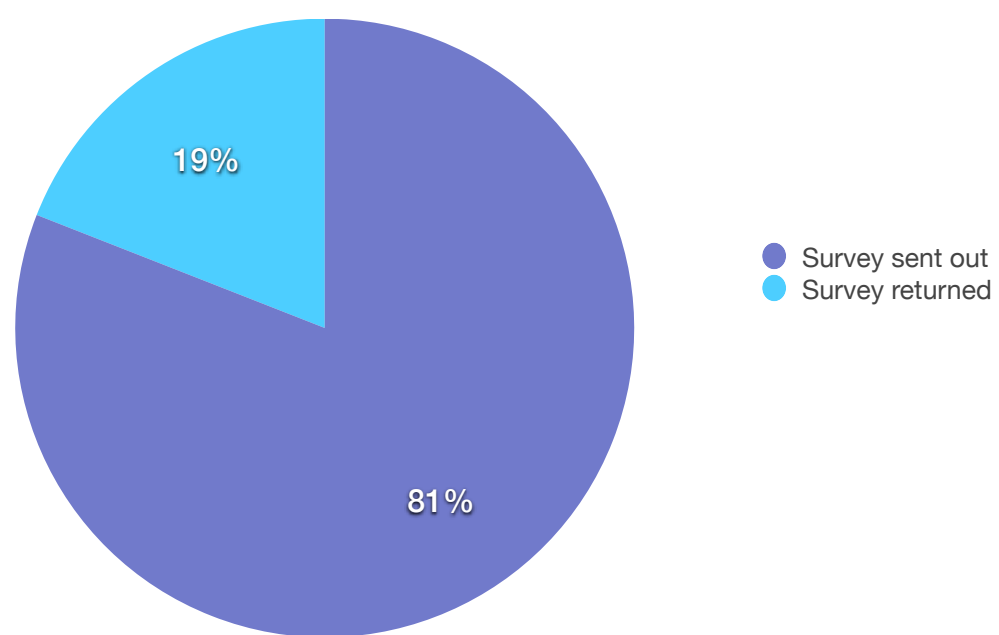
Q18) Overall I was satisfied with the outcome of the injection.
